Reconciliation as God's Mission

Dr. Célestin Musekura, Founder and President, African Leadership and Reconciliation Ministries (ALARM)

An internationally known speaker and author of several published works, Dr. Musekura has been a pastor in Rwanda, Africa Regional Director for MAP International, and MAP-Reconciliation Ministries. He was Associate Director for SIM-Urban Ministries in Nairobi, and he cofounded the Sudan Evangelical Alliance to help persecuted churches in their suffering and outreach. He has 3 Masters degrees and his Ph.D. is from Dallas Theological Seminary on contemporary models of forgiveness. Dr. Musekura serves as an adjunct professor at Dallas Theological Seminary and Criswell College.

The Question of the Gospel in a Racial Society

Steven Weathers, Director, Multicultural Ministries, Evangelical Free Church of America

Overseeing all ethnic and immigrant ministries in the EFCA, Mr. Weathers helps churches and districts understand the dynamics of race, ethnicity, and culture that operate within the evangelical church. He and his wife, Lisa, planted the multicultural, socioeconomically diverse One Fellowship Church in the Chicago suburbs. He also directed Trinity International University's Student Life Intercultural Development Office while engaging in a Ph.D. program in Intercultural Studies. He has served as an adjunct professor and REACH instructor at Trinity.
